Below are the services we offer all year round.

Scanning

Our team as all been trained by the owner of the practice and principle vet Andrew Gore with general diagnoses and dating. We are confident that we will give you accurate results.

Heifer teat sealing

There many benefits from teat sealing heifers, this show in the increasing number of clients that choose to do this service each year. A huge contributing factor to our teat seal team's success comes down to sedating our heifers for increased safety, allowing a thorough job.

Dry cow therapy

Like other services, we are also available to train anyone on farm who would like to learn how to safely and confidently perform the job without us on site. All team members in the teat sealing team receive annual training by a technical vet from Norbrook keep everyone up to date in their skills.

Vaccinations

Herd vaccinations are a busy time for our staff, from Lepto vaccinations to mineral injections, we do it all. We also do blood samples to get a good idea where your herd is at before calving with enough time to rectify any deficiencies or other problems they may have.

Disbudding

Global Vets, unlike some other clinics sedate all calves for disbudding, alongside local anaesthetic. All our veterinary and technician staff are training in sedating and reversing animals as well as any potential emergencies (the risk is low). Sedating limits the stress on the calves and has proven to help with growth rates. Lots of our clients will use this time to DNA test and/or tag. We also vaccinate at this time for any clostridial diseases as well as administer any minerals. We have two 'standards' gold and silver.
